This month we saw the running of the 39th Pichi Richi Marathon and although we had issues with the COVID in NSW preventing some athletes from attending it was a great turnout with good finishing times. Again thanks to all those hard working volunteers that assisted the Pt. Augusta Lions Club and our Council to make this happen. Also a special thanks to our sponsors especially The Great Northern Lodge our major sponsor who were also responsible for organising a clean-up of the pass prior to the event. Next year is the 40th Marathon and plans are underway to make it a bigger and better event.

As I mentioned in my last report we have received funding for Stage 2 of the bush food garden and more money towards out Streetscape project. This will see the final "loop" of the bush food walking track that will take it past the oval then along Oval Road to join up with the new footpaths giving three all-weather paths from North Quorn into the shopping and business area of town. These paths are wheelchair friendly and wide enough for mobile scooters (Gophers) and will save people having to walk on the roads. The centre path will also be well lit for night time access. The new Streetscape paving works will be starting in Hawker as well as many improvements around Blue Burt Park and for those that wish to discuss these improvements please call in and see our CEO who is in Hawker on Wednesdays (all day).

On a final note our CEO has been negotiating with the members of the Pichi Richi Railway Preservation Society who have agreed in principal to allow us to extend our War Memorial and for us to put in a gate and more direct access to the silo light show. Obviously this has to be ratified through a meeting of their committee but it is good to see this type of co-operation and I thank the members of the Preservation Society for that.


BUSH FOOD GARDEN PATH UPDATE

1220lm of concrete has been laid with loop to the bridge complete, with two small sections for access to be closed up.

Cut ins will be filled once remediation around site is complete and safe for access.

Shelter and power connection has been installed for the BBQ. Concrete from the path to the shelter is complete.

130lm of concrete to swimming pool carpark will be completed once main garden completed.
