One was for \$205,234 going towards Stage 2 of the Quorn Bush Tucker walk and the other for \$584,745 going towards the Streetscape Implementation in Quorn and Hawker. A great effort by all of our staff members who work together to secure these grants. This extra funding will go towards enhancing our streetscape plan and advancing our bushfood walkways and garden.

Budget time is with us and Council has been busy putting together our draft annual business plan, long term financial plan as well as our fees and charges and rating policy. These are now out for public consultation so now is time for you to have your say in regards to these. I also wish to take this opportunity to acknowledge the recent resignation of Councillor Annie Reubenicht and thank Annie for her service to Council.

It was great to see the launch of Flinders Gin recently and there is more activity in the private sector with several new shops opening in Quorn in the near future. We in Council recognise that private investment is vital for the sustainability of our towns. RDA Far North and Council may also be able to advise you on Government Grants that may be available.

The last 150m section of concrete is to be completed in the coming two weeks.
