MAYORAL REPORT

Another very busy month for Council and the communities. The influx of visitors has been great and continuing positive comments relating to all the developments and improvements around the area is very pleasing.

Council has begun budget and business planning with information for public consultation out to all for comment. I encourage everyone to have their input about the Councils proposals.

As previously talked about, the budget is proposed to be a sensible, conservative budget, with the minimum rate rise possible in the current circumstances.

With the CPI over 7% it is very difficult for everyone including Council, to maintain investment and cover costs with pressure on identifying savings. All members have been conscious of the ongoing pressure on households, business and individuals, with the cost-of-living skyrocketing for all the basics.

In the budget proposal, aligned with previous information, Council has worked with administration to achieve the minimum proposed rate rise possible of 4.95%. This is well below the Current CPI. In doing so, Council has also identified cost cutting measures that will have the least impact on service delivery.

Some of the positives out of the work done, is the cancellation of fees charged to locals for access to Warren Gorge, so locals can continue to enjoy this area without charge. A reduction in the CMWS fee for residents is also a positive.

Council has identified savings in other areas, and have decided that given the large investment over the past four (4) or so years of over \$6m in the Council district, and incentives for businesses and home buyers, the tightening of the belt in all areas has been interrogated and the generous incentives will be wound back.

We will still see investment and works being undertaken with a capital expenditure of \$2m still being possible, and these works will centre around basic infrastructure including road sheeting, resealing and new bitumenising in some areas. Works will continue to ensure all of the last four (4) years projects are completed to a high standard and grant opportunities are identified where financially affordable. Council is also investigating measures and options to prevent the ever-rising costs of waste management for the district from going even higher.

Positive news for the area is the ongoing enthusiasm of all the volunteer groups, including the success of the Hawker Races, the Pichi Richi Marathon, the fantastic news from the Quorn Jockey Club in respect of obtaining one of only 23 spots in Australia to Host the "Melbourne Cup", the Quandong Festival, the upcoming hosting of regional Legatus councils reps in Quorn, project completion and follow up works, proposed Quorn Hospital road carparking and footpath works to mention a few! And we should all continue to thank our volunteers in all clubs and organisations in the townships.

A quick mention of the "Slowdown" fundraiser held in Quorn. It was great to see magnificent turnout of the crowd for what was a high intensity game with minimal injuries from a varied age and skilled footballers! The game provided plenty of humour and comments within the crowd and the money raised went to the worthy cause of the Australian Red Cross.

We look forward to an update relating to health services and the "new doctors' for Quorn and surrounds, and will keep people "posted" as best we can.
