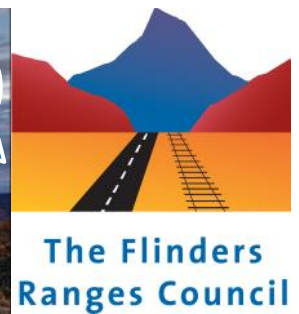

MAYORS MESSAGE

More good news this month as we have received notification that two funding applications to the Regional Airports Program were successful. The first was for the sealing of the runway at Quorn so not only will this airstrip be fenced and have a new lit windsock it will enable all weather landing primarily for the Royal Flying Doctor. Council is also moving a surplus demountable to the site that includes toilets, showers, and an office. The second grant is for the resurfacing of the runway at Hawker off-setting a large renewal cost to Council that was going to occur in the near future.

Work on two of our other major projects is progressing nicely. Unfortunately rain has slowed progress on the streetscape project with adjustments having to be made by the contractors, but all is in hand and it is starting to take shape. The bushfood gardens and walkway is also progressing nicely notably with a new barbeque shelter completed and lights on the middle path in place. The next phase of the streetscape project will begin shortly as they prepare to lay new pavers in Hawker.

We are also seeking interest from those businesses and residents that wish to take part in the main street revitalisation project with matched funding of up to \$5,000 available. If you are interested and have not already received a letter or have not been contacted by our projects team, please call us for your application form.

On a final note, we have three candidates for our up-coming supplementary election for two new Councillors. These people are your voice in regards to what happens in our community so please become involved.

MAINSTREETS(S) FACELIFT PROJECT-ROI's OPEN

Funding provided by the National Radioactive Waste Management Facility Community Benefit Programme has enabled Council to undertake a project focused on providing for buildings in the main streets of Quorn, Hawker and Cradock to receive a "facelift". A total of \$200,000 is available under the project, with matched funding available for eligible properties up to the value of \$5,000. Further information is available from www.frc.sa.gov.au.

SUPPLEMENTARY ELECTION

At the close of nominations at 12 noon on Thursday 5 August 2021, a total of three nominations were received and accepted for the FRC Supplementary Election. As only two vacancies exist, the supplementary election will now go to public vote. The three candidates (in official ballot paper order) are:

Voting material will be forwarded to electors between 23 and 30 August 2021. To be accepted, ballot papers must be completed and returned to the Returning Officer by 12 noon, Monday 13 September 2021.

A ballot box will be located at the Council Office for electors who wish to personally deliver their completed voting materials during office hours.

The scrutiny and count of ballot papers will be held at 1pm on Wednesday 15 September 2021 with a provisional declaration made at the conclusion of the election.

Council encourages all electors to have their say and vote in the Council election.

HAWKER PAVING WORKS

The planned start date for the paving upgrades in Hawker is Monday 13 September 2021. The works will start at the intersection of Wilpena Road and Cradock Road following meetings with business owners. The works will replace existing and footpath surfaces along Elder Terrace, Wilpena Road and near the war memorial.

Contractors are planning to be in Hawker for 4-5 weeks.

The works are part of the Council Streetscape Masterplan to upgrade identified sections of streets that provide crucial links to community facilities and will improve access and amenity for the streetscapes of Quorn and Hawker.



QUORN SILO LIGHT SHOW—NEW PROJECTION

A new projection for the Quorn Silo Light Show has kicked off which includes "Rush of Steam" featuring the Pichi Richi Railway and narrated by volunteer Jeremy Browne.

YELLOW RECYCLE BIN

What goes in the yellow lid bin you ask!

Where possible, items are to be rinsed, with lids off

- Glass bottles & jars
- Aluminium, steel and aerosol cans (Empty)
- All plastic containers
- Cartons—Milk, juice, etc... (Flattened)
- Paper, cardboard, (Flattened) newspaper and magazines

NO PLASTIC BAGS, CHEMICALS, CERAMICS, BUILDING MATERIALS, HOUSEHOLD WASTE, NAPPIES OR GREEN WASTE



Do you have an item not listed and you are not sure, where to put it? Head to www.whichbin.sa.gov.au type in the item in the search bar to find the correct bin.

If still in doubt put in the Red Bin.

Reminder: Upon payment of your first quarter rates (or full rates) you can collect your 2021/2022 waste vouchers. If you haven't collected your waste vouchers for the 2020/2021 these are still available and valid until 30 September 2021.
