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RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Where the words "The Society" are used, it shall read as meaning the Royal Northern Agricultural, Horticultural and Floricultural Society.
2. The Society shall consist of members who pay annual subscriptions of not less than \$15.00. Annual subscriptions shall date from the 1st December to the 30th of November, the following year.
3. \$15.00 Membership consists of, 2 adults
4. \$20.00 Family Membership consists of, 2 adults and 3 children
5. Admissions to the Show is \$10.00 per adult, \$2.00 per school-age children and \$5.00 per aged pensioners with an entitlement card. *Pre-school children are FREE.*
6. New Memberships must be applied for at least 10 days prior to the Show.
7. All exhibitors must lodge their application for space required with the *TRADE SPACE CO-ORDINATOR* at QUORN.
8. No person, other than judges and stewards, are allowed in show ring while horses are in action, unless the person or persons have been given permission by the Steward / s.
9. The Society will give every facility possible to exhibitors, and ample space will be afforded for all exhibits, but no responsibility or liability will be incurred, nor accepted by the Society.
10. All exhibits must be placed, by the exhibitor, within the space allotted by the Committee.
11. All exhibits in all Sections must be the Bona-fide property of the exhibitor.
12. All exhibits in all sections **G, I, J, K, L & M** must have been grown or manufactured by the exhibitor.
13. No single exhibit shall be entered for more than one First Prize at this Show excepting **A, B, C, D, E** whether First Prize winner or not, may compete in any Class if duly entered.
14. Any exhibitor giving a wrong name or description of his or her exhibit, with the intention of defrauding the Society, shall be disqualified as far as the sub committee for the sections in which the entry has been wrongly made shall deem fit, and may be debarred from exhibiting at any future show of this Society.
15. Any exhibitor in any way wilfully altering, or writing on his or her entry ticket, before the judges have made their awards, shall be disqualified, in all classes, for which he or she has entered at this Show.
15. Any person interfering with the judges, whilst in the execution of their duties, may be expelled from the Showground.
16. No exhibitor shall have any communication with the judges whilst in the execution of their duties, under penalty of disqualification. Should any information be required by the judge, the same must be obtained through the Steward of the Section.

RULES & REGULATIONS

17. All persons other than the officers and servants of this Society, and the judges, shall leave the hall at 10:00 am until the Hall is declared open to the Public at 12:30pm.
18. The judges are empowered to decide the age of, and call for proof of, the age of any animal exhibited.
19. Protests against awards must be made, in writing, and lodged with the Society Secretary, 60 minutes after prize is awarded. Protests in all classes must be accompanied by a deposit of \$10.00, this sum will be forfeited to the Society if the protest is deemed to be frivolous by the committee, for the Section in which the protest is made, but the deposit will be returned if the protest is upheld. Any prize awarded by the judges which is withheld in consequence of a valid protest, may be awarded by them to the exhibitor next in order of merit.
20. Any Disputes or Complaints must be directed to the Disputes Committee.
21. Judges are empowered to withhold prizes where the exhibits are considered unworthy. They may award similar prize money in lieu of First and Second.
22. To arrive at aggregate points for winners of any section, it will be as follows :- First - 5 points, Second - 3 points, Third - 1 point to determine the winner.
23. No exhibit shall be removed from the showground before 4:00pm on the day of the show. PENALTY – Forfeiture of prize money and / or fine, as the Committee may decide.
24. All exhibits shall be on the ground, and in their allotted space, before 10:00 am, unless otherwise stated, and all livestock shall be under perfect control, whilst on the Showgrounds.
25. When entering livestock in the Section A, the age shall be given in months, if the animal is under the age of 2 years.
26. The committee reserves the right to reject any entry to the showground of any exhibit they deem infected with disease, lice or any other disability, contagious to, or cause interference with any other exhibits.
27. All entries CLOSE WITH SECRETARY, at his / her office, the FRIDAY prior to the Show and all entries shall be made in writing on form provided, or in a similar manner, accompanied by the exhibitor, or agent, duly authorised.
28. No person will be admitted to the Show Hall on the day of the show before 12:30pm, except on business.
29. The balance sheet of the Society shall be drawn up and presented duly audited, at the Annual General Meeting of Subscribers.
30. The President and or an Officer appointed by the Society may withdraw any exhibit from being Judged without any reason being given.
31. The President and Secretary and or an Appointed Officer of the Society shall have power to enter any side show at any time they wish, free from any charge.

- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse to accept any entry, or having received same, to refuse to allow the exhibit to compete, without assigning any reason therefore.
- To be eligible for the Grand Aggregate Trophy the Exhibitor must attend at least three (3) shows in the Association, (excluding Pigeons and Poultry). To be eligible for the Grand Aggregate Trophy in Pigeons and Poultry the Exhibitor must attend at least four (4) Shows in the Association.
- Entries is the Laucke / CWA Scone, the Rich Fruit Cake and Genoa Cake competitions at the Quorn Show must be prepared to travel to the

State Finals if they win. If the winner is not willing to attend and compete in the State Finals in any of the categories then they will forfeit the place and prize for winning the local competition and the runner up will be awarded the First place and prizes on the above conditions.

RICH FRUIT CAKE & GENOA CAKE COMPETITION

CLASS

43. **NO ENTRY FEE.**

EXHIBITORS OWN RECIPE IS TO BE USED AND CAKE IS NOT TO BE ICED.

There is no restriction on the ingredients used. As a general guideline the Genoa Cake should contain Sultanas, Currants, Cherries and Almonds. Cake may be decorated with Almonds.

WHAT THE JUDGES ARE LOOKING FOR IN A RICH FRUIT AND GENOA CAKE.

Scores are allocated: 50% appearance - 25% texture - 25% taste/flavour

- **Appearance:** Smooth appearance on top, bottom and sides. No sign of shiny, dark, overheated fruit protruding from the surface. The cake should be firm, smooth, fresh and not too moist to touch but not too dry either. Preferably with a well ripened patina on the top.
- **Surface:** Straight sides and a smooth flat top showing even distribution of fruit.
- **Finish in Baking:** No bumps, hollows or sunken centers, not large cracks (a small crack is not a major fault). The cake should cut cleanly, without any crumbs and without catching and dragging of fruit. There should be no burning or crusty top or sides (caused by too hot an oven or insufficient papering). After the cake is cut, the fruit closest to the outside should not appear to be dark and shiny (caused by overcooking in too hot an oven). This fault causes a bitter flavour. No air bubbles in the finished cake.
- **Colour:** Attractive, even, Golden - Brown on the top, bottom and sides. A darker colour for the Rich Fruit Cake.
- **Texture:** Firm and fine, it should be moist, not soggy nor dry. The texture should be smooth and even and the same right through the cake. A well ripened cake cuts cleanly and evenly.
- **Flavour and aroma:** Delicious and should be a perfect blend of fresh eggs and dairy ingredients, sugar, essences, flour, spices, sherry or brandy and quality dried fruits. Beware of an overpowering flavour or aroma of essences, spices or the acrid smell of overheated fruit.
- **Decoration:** Do not decorate the Rich Fruit Cake with almonds. The Genoa Cake may be decorated with almonds.
- **Presentation:** Remove all paper from the cake before exhibiting. No cake cooler marks (cool on an upturned cake tin).

60g of chopped Red Glazed Cherries	200ml of Sherry or Brandy.
1 Teaspoon of Baking Powder.	1 Teaspoon of Mixed Spices.

METHOD: Mix together all fruits and soak in the Sherry or Brandy overnight. Sift together flour, Baking Powder and Spice. Cream together the Butter and Sugar. Add the Eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition and then alternatively add the Fruit and Flour and lastly the Chopped Nuts. Mix thoroughly. Place mixture into a prepared square tin (19 - 22cm approx. in size). Bake in a slow oven for approx. 3 - 3 1/2 Hours.
