Walking Trails

All five Trails cleared and signposted 1–4 offer spectacular Summit Views

1. The Dutchman's Stern Park

Drive 8.5 km via Arden Vale Rd from Quorn to Car Park 10.6 km circuit (easier clockwise) or 8.4 km return via Terrace/Northern Trail or 6 km return to Stony Creek Lookout or 5 km return to Terrace Lookout

2. Warren Gorge

Drive 22 km via Arden Vale Rd from Quorn to Trailhead 5.2 km circuit (easier clockwise)

3. Devil's Peak

Drive 10 km via Richman Valley Road & Devil's Pk Rd to start 2.6 km return (some scrambling last 300 m near top)

4. Mount Brown Park

Drive 14 km via Richman Valley Road to Olive Grove to start 15 km circuit or 12 km return via Western Trail or 5.4 km return to Bald Hill Lookout

5. Waukarie Creek

Drive 14 km via Richman Valley Road to Olive Grove to start 12 km return to Woolshed Flat Railway Station or 2 km return to Heysen Trail Shelter

Pictures — from the Past






A SADDLE-TANK locomotive has its water tank wrapped part-way around its boiler, as you can see in the second photo to the left, where the tank is being filled from Quorn's overhead water tower. And in the third pic are two of these locos, NB 29 and NB30, in front of the Quorn Loco Shed in 1954. The engine number in the top photo is blocked, and might be either a 29 or a 30. Of course, the water in such tanks would, once such locos were working, be already heated up.

These two saddle-tank locos did shunting work in the Quorn Railway Station yard, starting in the 1920s. And they bore the nickname of 'Pug'. This gives you one clue to how busy a Station Yard like Quorn's must have been for many decades until 1972, and also a clue to how large the Station's railway staff must have been.

I'm not sure where I got the fourth photo on the top of the next page. I think I was hitching rides after walking all the way around the top of the Wilpena Pound Range after the line was no longer worked, and that I took the photo of NB30 rusting away, abandoned somewhere near Quorn. \rightarrow





→ For me at the time, it felt a little sad to think of such a lonely end to a loco that had had such a busy life. On the other hand, I suspect I may have got the pic from the SA Archives where I sometimes spent many days or even weeks doing research work, and often bought copies of such 10×8 photos, mostly taken in the Flinders Ranges—for the then remarkable price of two shillings each!

The 2nd & 3rd pics are by Reg Mayes, in John Evans's great book, *Proceed to Hawker* (2008). Evans wrote two similar books to this, *Proceed to Quorn* (2009), & *Proceed to Wilmington* (2010). All three are well worth reading, and are full of wonderful photos, though obviously the Wilmington book isn't about Quorn, as the line to Wilmington from the south didn't come as far as Quorn.



On Saturday 25th March the Quorn Kernels who play in the Northern Flinders Cricket Association played Copley at Copley. Quorn batted first and made 105 with top scorers being Mark Francis and Cleyton Finlay. Copley then passed this score with the loss of one wicket.

The Quorn Cricket Club has been fortunate to have a number of boys travelling from Hawker to play in the junior teams this year ensuring that the Under 13's and Under 16's are able to field sides and be competitive in the Port Augusta Cricket Association.

Under 16 players Jack Allen and Joel Finlay have also been regular members of the A grade side.



GRANTS FOR NATIVE PLANTS

Local schools and community groups can receive up to \$300 worth of native plants to establish native gardens with students and community group members. The *Planting Native Gardens* initiative has been funded by the Port Augusta-Quorn Landscape Group.

GRASSROOTS GRANTS

A new funding pool of \$100,000 is available to address environmental projects in the SA Arid Lands.

The 2023/24 Grassroots Grants funding round opened today and is available for projects undertaken by volunteers, community groups, not-for-profit organisations and landholders to help sustainably manage local landscapes through on-ground works and building community capacity.

Grants of up to \$10,000 are available and applications will be open for two months. Projects need to address one or more of the board's priority issues of climate resilience, water management, sustainable land management, protecting and enhancing biodiversity and people and partnerships. SA Arid Lands Landscape Board chair Douglas Lillecrapp said the current round of Grassroots Grants are a timely opportunity to address a wide range of projects and ideas in landscape management. Mr Lillecrapp said the board encourages landholder groups, volunteer networks and Aboriginal communities to consider how their ideas align with the goals of the Grassroots Grants program, and the board's priority issues. "I encourage the community to make contact with board staff to talk through project ideas and be supported to develop applications.

"In 2022/23, the SA Arid Lands Landscape Board funded 30 projects. They included rabbit control, weed control, erosion management, protection of native species, community projects, cultural skills training, brochures, guest speakers and rehabilitation works. Applications for this year's round will close on Monday 8 May 2023 at 5pm. 


