MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Welcome to the start of a new year and a great start for Council with the addition of two new permanent members of staff, Paula Osborn (Governance Officer) and Sean Cheriton (Director of Finance and Administration). We now have a full complement of staff for the first time in many years. We also have a defined management structure enabling staff to plan a career in Council. The staff selection process is also paying off as we see detailed street maintenance plans and greater scrutiny and control over all our projects.

We also have been successful in regards to the National Radioactive Waste Facility Community Benefit Program Grants with money for our Streetscape and town beautification programs including upgraded entrances into all of our Communities. Other significant grants include \$349k towards the Quorn Lions Park Agricultural Museum and \$100k feasibility study and business plan for a Geotourism and Visitor Centre for Hawker.

Other great news is the application by the Yadlamalka Power Company to build a solar power generator with battery storage at Neuroodla (near Hawker) that will require a large workforce for its construction. We also see an application for a small 'gin' distillery in Quorn that intends to use bushfoods in the distilling process as well as for flavouring the gin. This product, to be sold locally, supports our label as the "Bush Food Capital" of Australia.

In regards to our bushfood project we have now let the contract for the first major works to be carried out and we also see enthused volunteers working on that project and the Lions Park Project. I think we are very lucky, and certainly thankful, to have so many volunteers that work hard in all three of our communities.

Our major Streetscape project, the Railway Terrace Upgrade is also nearing fruition as we move towards the final design and tender details. Council would like to thank residents for their input on our surveys tied to these projects as this enables us to move forward knowing that the community is happy with what we are doing.

IMPORTANT – before filling out a nomination form we strongly encourage you to call the CEO Eric Brown on 08 8620 0500 for advice. Candidates often use the wrong form, or fill in the form incorrectly, which can result in a nomination not being accepted. Make sure you get advice before nominating and then submit your nomination well before the deadline of 12 noon, Thursday 28 January 2021.

Please note that late nominations cannot be accepted. It is strongly recommended that you lodge your nomination early to allow time to rectify any potential problems.

PROJECTS UPDATE

Quorn Community Hall

Completed work at the community hall include, re-sheeting of Internal walls and ceilings, installation of new DDA compliant doorways, a new storeroom, an upgrade to the lighting and switchboard, installation of veranda and paving and a disability access ramp. New windows have been installed with the two servery windows to follow. Tiling of both male and female amenities has begun, along with installation of cubicles. Toilets will be completed once urinal and toilet pans are installed.



Hawker Dog Park

Hawker Dog Park works are in full swing.

The new shelter has had the roof installed, which had been delayed due to strong winds.

Water supply pipe work for the park is being installed will provide water for irrigation as well as drinking bowls for your canine companions.
