

# Mayors Message

Hello to all our residents.

As we progress through Easter and ANZAC Day, things are starting to get busier around the region. This is certainly the case for Council, as we undertake consultation around our new Community Plan and head into our Annual Business Plan and Budget planning phase. All residents are urged to have a look at the Community Plan, which provides the high-level guidance framework for Council over the coming years, and let us know what you think we have right or wrong!

Most will now know that earlier in the month it was announced that The Flinders Ranges Council was granted eligibility for Drought Communities Program funding which is terrific news for our community. We were very disappointed to have missed out in the previous announcement and made our concerns known to the Federal Government in a meeting with Minister McKenzie arranged by Rowan Ramsay. Thanks to strong lobbying by Council, Rowan Ramsay as our Federal Member, and a number of other regional bodies we now have access to this program and will be assessing potentially eligible projects in the coming week.

Council also engaged with organisation of the Pichi Richi Marathon, to be held on 30 June. We will be assisting with the event management and scheduling in conjunction with Rotary Pt Augusta and Pt Augusta Council to ensure the event continues for the region. Many community members expressed a willingness to be involved with organisation, in the midst of disruption around last year's event. We would welcome your involvement now as this year's event comes together, with an intention to re-establish a Marathon Committee to convene subsequent events. ## ON-FARM INFRASTRUCTURE WATER GRANTS

The On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate scheme is available for drought affected farmers in South Australia to help farmers install new water infrastructure to improve drought resilience and protect livestock.

Eligible farmers can access a one-off 25 per cent rebate up to \$25,000, which can be applied to: new purchases and installation of, pipes, water storages, water pumps, de-silting dams, drilling of new stock water bores and associated infrastructure including: desalination plants, power supply such as generators. The rebate scheme covers work undertaken from 1 July 2018. The aim of this rebate is to help primary producers improve productivity, address animal welfare needs and become more resilient for future droughts.

Eligible farmers will be able to apply through the State Government's Department for Primary Industries and Regions SA (PIRSA) for the rebate. The scheme will close on 31 March 2021 or when the funding allocation is exhausted, whichever occurs first.
