MAYORS MESSAGE

There is a lot of activity around Quorn with works being carried out in Railway Terrace and the Bush Foods walk and gardens. Not only are our Contractors busy but so are our volunteers and staff with real visible changes occurring. I, for one, did not expect to see so much change in such a short period of time. With the tourist season approaching we are in for some hectic times.

Hawker will also start to see similar project work in the coming twelve to eighteen months as we receive our grant agreements from the Federal Department of Industry, Science, Energy and Resources as a result of the NRWMF Community Benefit Program. These include Feasibility Study for the Hawker Geotourism and Visitors Centre, Flinders Ranges Tourist Trail, Drought, Grants and Publicity Support Officer, another stage of the 10-year Streetscape Master Plan, Quorn Lions Park Agricultural Museum and the Main Streets Facelift strategy.

An interesting meeting of Council was held this month with lots of input and discussion from all Councillors. Of note there was a presentation from the committee set up to look at the establishment of sites in the Flinders Ranges region to be added to World Heritage listing. I am pleased to announce that Deputy Mayor Ken Anderson will be representing Council on that committee and I am sure his knowledge and experience in our National Parks will be of great value to that initiative. We will also start to see our CEO spending one day a week in Hawker.

Great to see the Sundowner explorer operating, even having to add carriages to cater for added demand again demonstrating the value of this asset to our community. This would not be happening if it wasn't for the extraordinary effort put in by the volunteers that keep the Pichi Richi Railway operating and on behalf of the community I thank you for that.

Last but not least, Council won Silver for Best Mega Mural at the 2020 Australian Street Art Awards for the Quorn Silo with the gold award and Best of the Best award going to Karoonda, another rural South Australian Community. These projects are valuable as they attract art trail visitors again demonstrating that communities are making good use of drought funding. That and with plenty of media attention during the month keeps our name up there at a time we have lots of grant applications submitted.

RAILWAY TERRACE STREETSCAPE PROJECT

The Railway Terrace Streetscape project (which was fully funded by the Commonwealth Government) is progressing well with kerbing and paving works underway. HAWKER STREETSCAPE

Council will be consulting with the Hawker community from early July on the entrance way and streetscaping project which received \$265,000 in funding under the NRWMF Community Benefit Fund. This project is expected to provide a significant refresh of the entrance way and landscaping around the Wilpena Pound Road entrance into Hawker.


ANZAC DAY SERVICES
