MAYORAL REPORT

For the past three decades and more, the township of Quorn has grappled with a persistent water quality issue. The Flinders Ranges Council, its residents, and previous administrations have tirelessly advocated for a solution, to no avail.

SA Water's official statistics indicate only 3% of residents drink the water due to its poor quality, in respect of calcium, chlorine and salt content this is obviously not something new for residents.

The water is Undrinkable , Unsavoury and Unacceptable AND it's Unthinkable that in the 21st Century a community has to put up with this poor quality, basic of services that most other communities take for granted.

Over the last 12 months, the Council has engaged in extensive negotiations with the government, including the Deputy Premier, Local members and federal representatives, Agencies' including SA Water and The Essential Services Commission of SA (ESCOSA) all in an attempt to address this ongoing issue. Whilst the 12 months of hard work offered some hope of gaining a position on the SA Waters 4 year investment plan, we again seem to have been relegated to the long term plan, with no commitment of funding to solve the issue.

Council has again (after an initial submission in the previous SA Water's 4 year plan back in 2020), placed another submission to SA Water to review their plan and to include Quorn's water quality issue in the funding.

Despite our best efforts and the resilience of Quorn's residents, progress has remained elusive. We find ourselves at a critical juncture, requiring a collective response from all residential South Australians.

The water supply problem in Quorn has not only persisted but increased costs for each individual in the township of Quorn (figures of at least \$1,000 per person per year on replacement costs for plumbing fixtures, hot water systems, washing machines to mention a few). We have seen the toll it takes on our community, both socially and the economic stress that our elderly and vulnerable residents are subjected to. In the face of this protracted struggle, we are intending to reach out to our fellow South Australians, seeking support and collaboration in our campaign for an improved water quality in Quorn.

The water quality issue in Quorn is not just a local concern; it is emblematic of the broader challenges our region faces. The Flinders Ranges is a crucial part of South Australia's identity, and a thriving Quorn is essential to the success and well-being of the entire region and state. Access to reliable quality water is fundamental to sustaining our community, fostering growth, visitation and preserving the unique heritage of Quorn.

As we prepare to launch this campaign for Quorn's water quality improvement, we urge all residents to join us in our pursuit. We believe that by uniting our voices and resources, we can bring this long-standing issue to the fore.

We will be asking for comments and input of photos and evidence of the economic cost for residents to be lodged through a council website and information relating to how you

can register your support to get this issue fixed. More details on how and where will be circulated through Council's newsletter and Facebook page in the near future.

In the coming months, we will be sharing our concerns with the broader public of South Australia and offer opportunities for collaboration. Together, we can ensure that Quorn and the Flinders Ranges not only survive but thrive.

Thank you all for your ongoing support and dedication to the betterment of our community.

EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST SOUGHT

"Buckaringa" Shop Lease - 40 First Street, Quorn

Council is seeking expressions of interest from potential businesses (either new or existing) for the lease of the "Buckaringa" at 40 First Street, Quorn.

The shop is in a prominent location and interacts directly with the newly constructed Quorn Public Square. The shop is over 280m2 in size, with a large shop front area, bathroom, kitchen and storage rooms.

Council is seeking to obtain a commercial return on the building and a lease fee would be payable, this would be negotiated based on a rental valuation. However, as the building requires work on the interior, Council would be interested in considering an offset for a part of the fit out against lease fees. Council may also be able to complete some internal work to assist a potential business

It is expected that any expressions of interest would be put to Council for decision.

A basic form is required to be completed as part of a submission as well as a business plan and other information.
