

## **MAYOR'S MESSAGE**

Great news this month with the notification of grants received through the Local Government Infrastructure Partnership Program (\$572,254) and Local Government Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (\$302,049) this is on top of the \$265,000 from the National Radioactive Waste Community Benefit Program with all going towards the Streetscape initiative. Council with the contributing \$286,122 from the 2021-2022 budget and the same from the 2022-2023 budget. The Streetscape Plan was a 10 year initiative with a total budget of around \$1.8M, with this news it means that that project will be virtually completed in the next two years.

Lots of activity continues around town with two volunteer days of planting in the Bush Foods gardens moving that project forward with nearly 50 volunteers involved. Works are also moving ahead in the old Lions Park by the Quorn Pioneer Machinery Society. Not only have they been moving equipment around but also renovating it and getting prepared to build their pavilion. One of the aspects that stands out with these volunteers is their passion as they visit other communities to get ideas to make this museum very special. Again on behalf of the community I thank you for your efforts as we develop The Flinders Ranges Council into the preferred area to visit in South Australia.

Unfortunately I have to finish on a "down" note as we have been informed that clean/palatable water for Quorn has been pushed out by several years. We are requesting a meeting with the appropriate Minister to see if we can change their minds. I will keep you all informed of any progress on this.

## **PROJECT UPDATE**

# **Quorn Community Hall**

- Installation of new lino flooring and new roller shutters and zip screen blinds have been completed.
- Painting began on 6 April
- Next steps are for cabinetry to be installed and a reroof of the facility. This will mean forgoing upgrades to the kitchen at this point in time.

# **Bush Food Path - Stage 1**

- 100m of concrete has been installed Electrical conduit was laid prior to concrete to allow for lighting down the track
- Shelter for the BBQ area has been quoted and DA applied for.
- Garden planting day undertaken on April 9th and 10th with 600 plants
- Next step is installation of irrigation and continuation of path installation.

### Railway Terrace Upgrade

Work on Railway Terrace has been underway for 6 weeks. To date the following work has been completed:

- 425m of Kerbing and Spoon Drain
- 3 x build outs which will allow access from North to South
- 4 x Pram Ramps for accessibility and 3 driveway crossovers with 300m2 of Pavers laid.


# ANZAC DAY SERVICES

# LOCAL GOVERNMENT INFRASTRUCTURE PARTNERSHIP FUNDING

Great news! Council has been successful in its application for \$572,245 in funding to implement the streetscape works under the Local Government Infrastructure Partnership Program.

The project was for the finalisation of much of the streetscape works identified as part of the recently developed streetscape masterplan for Hawker and Quorn, including:

- Creation of a Performing and Visual Arts Precinct in Quorn
- Development of entry markers and signage at the 'gateways' to Hawker and Quorn
- Reconfiguration and development of key intersections to enhance safe pedestrian access and to enable outdoor dining
- Development of a walking path, connecting Hawker's War Memorial and Dog Parks and providing a link the town centre

This is very exciting news and provides an amazing opportunity to refresh the appearance of both Quorn and Hawker.
