CORONA VIRUS

20th November 2020

In accordance with the new COVID Stay at Home directive issued by the Premier and the Government of South Australia, it has been assessed and determined that the following non-essential Council facilities will be closed until further notice:

- Hawker Swimming Pool;
- Quorn Swimming Pool;
- The Visitor Information Centre (Quorn);
- Quorn Community Hall;
- Quorn Town Hall;
- Hawker Institute;
- Quorn Skate Park;
- Quorn Courthouse Museum;
- All Parks, Gardens, Ovals, Reserves, Playgrounds, Walking Trails and Open Areas;
- All Public Toilets;
- Quorn Silo Art Projection;
- Waste Transfer Station Quorn;
- Landfill Hawker;

Community and other organisations that lease or otherwise occupy Council owned facilities will be directed by Council to close.

Public Access to the following Council facilities are closed although they will continue to function at an operational level:

- Council Depot Quorn;
- Council Depot Hawker;

The following facilities will remain 'open' at this time:

- Council Office Quorn;

Please be aware that additional COVID safety measures will be in place at these sites.

The normal weekly refuse collection and fortnightly recycling collections will continue as normal.

Council will continue to assess the risk for staff and the community over the coming days and will keep the community informed of any changes. Significant work is underway to ensure that Council continues to be well prepared and can deliver all required essential services.
