MAYORAL REPORT



The Fringe events were a huge success. Large crowds converged on Quorn to enjoy the free entertainment - and what entertainment it was! From Cirkidz to acrobatics and magic and some amazing local musicians thrown in as well. Many community groups and businesses jumped on the band wagon and catered for the event, which was also fantastic to see. Congratulations to all involved in organising these events and we hope to keep bringing them to you year after year.

The unveiling of the Faith Thomas AM memorial plaque coincided with the all grades cricket grand finals at the Quorn Oval. The plaque is a wonderful memorial to Faith and her contributions to sport and nursing. The ceremony was graced by tributes from various dignitaries and attended by members of the Thomas Family.

Quorn Water Quality Campaign Update

Campaigning continues for the improvement of Quorn's water quality. The ABC7.30 report undertook extensive filming and interviewing on the 19th February at Quorn with that story being broadcast on the 11th March.

I would like to again thank the community for the incredible turn out on a 38-degree day with little notice and the response we have received from all around that state has been very supportive.

The Essential Services Commission of SA accepted an invitation to address Council regarding our water quality issues. When we confirm the date we will let the community know where and when that is to occur.

Health and Wellbeing Hub Update

A new committee has been formed called the "Quorn Health and Wellbeing Hub Committee" for the purpose of initiating, researching, consulting and investigating options for the development of a community health and wellbeing hub in Quorn. Please see the expression of interest for three (3) community representatives later in this newsletter and I ask any community members interested in being part of this committee to seriously consider putting their hand up if they have an interest in this topic.

Care in Motion (Formerly Northern Passenger Transport Services) Update

The Care in Motion Board will be holding their general meeting in Quorn on the 11th April 2024. Community members are invited to attend from 1.00pm at the Council office to meet and discuss Care in Motion's possible services in the District, the community's needs in the areas of aged transport, as well as other programs operated by Care In Motion. Housing Options for Quorn and Hawker

The CEO and myself had a statewide linkup with the LGA, Renewal SA and the Minister for Housing and Urban Development relating to Government plans for the provision of funding for housing within regional cities and towns. We subsequently met with Renewal SA and discussed the process for application for funding up to \$2m for provision of housing for aged care, health workers, educational workers and service providers for Quorn and Hawker.

Council had previously worked on freeing up land options to be made available for this purpose and we are in the process of developing the funding application to be able to be part of the whole of government program.

I will continue to provide updates in the process and progress of this application and what opportunities that this may present the communities.

Backpacker Visitation to the Region

COVID-19 saw a severe drop in backpackers coming not only to the region but Australia wide, this has affected seasonal worker numbers, backpacker visitation and subsequent effect on accommodation and tourism services that relied on this demographic.

The CEO and I are intending to meet with the Regional Development Minister and the South Australian Tourism Commission to discuss what strategies are being put in place to encourage the return of this segment of visitors, which will assist our business and tourism operators in the future.

We will ensure we give the community (and businesses) updates as we continue to advocate for our communities.

Recognition Continues

It has been fantastic that work of the community and council continues to be recognised, not only with recent awards including winning Gold in the 2023 Australian Street Awards for the Best Entrance Art for the Hawker Entranceway and Silver in the 2023 Grey Nomad Awards for Best Trail and also for Cradock Hotel winning Bronze in the 2023 Grey Nomad Awards for Best Pub Stay, but now we see the Hawker War Memorial being filmed by the Australia War Memorial to feature on a large screen cinematic film display of memorials representing the country. The film will welcome visitors to the Australian War Memorial and serve as a reminder of its integral connection to all local memorials across the nation. This really does demonstrate what a vibrant driven community we live in, congratulations to all involved and truly well deserved.

I hope everyone has a safe and happy Easter break and I look forward to what is going to be a busy period for the Council District.

HAWKER HOME TO AUSTRALIA'S BEST ENTRANCE ART

The Flinders Ranges Council is absolutely thrilled that the Hawker Entranceway has received top honours at the 2023 Australian Street Art Awards as announced Friday 9 March 2024.

Mayor Ken Anderson said that the Hawker Entranceway project is a shining example of the commitment and collaboration between Council and the community.

"The Hawker Entranceway is a beacon of community pride, and beckons travellers to stop and explore the rich offerings of the region. Anchored by iconic 2m high 'HAWKER' signage, the project encompasses a powerful narrative of cultural preservation and community rejuvenation. The signage works as an ambassador for the town and region, encouraging travellers to immerse themselves in the unique offerings of Hawker before exploring the path less travelled through the Flinders Ranges."

The Australian Street Art Awards recognises and celebrates outstanding contributions to street art projects that enrich the cultural fabric of communities across the country. Projects are evaluated based on creativity, community impact and their ability to inspire and engage.

Awards Director, Liz Rivers said "Artworks are unique and therefore clever communities promote their outdoor art, including welcome art, as a unique attraction that visitors can see in only one place."

The judges congratulated The Flinders Ranges Council for investing in this sculptural work to maximise return from their public art. "We love that this entranceway holds a special place in the heart of its community and incorporates stylised elements that have helped forge Hawker's modern identity from its ancient roots", the judges said.

The Hawker entranceway was one of fourteen destinations recognised with a Gold Award for exceptional outdoor art across Australia this year.

The Flinders Ranges Council also won Silver in the 2023 Grey Nomad Award for Best Trail for the Flinders Ranges Self Drive Loop with Mayor Ken Anderson saying that "the popularity of this driving trail grows every day with visitors seeking different driving experiences." Mayor Anderson also congratulated the Cradock Hotel on winning Bronze in the 2023 Grey Nomad Award for Best Pub Stay.
