NEW QUORN SILO LIGHT SHOW STORIES



BY-LAW No. 4 - Moveable Signs

Councils By-Law 4, Moveable Signs, is in place to enhance the amenity of roads and surrounding parts, to protect the safety and comfort of the general public and to also assist businesses to safely promote themselves.

The types of moveable signs include 'A' frame, or sandwich boards, inverted 'T' signs or flat signs which must be placed on the footpath area (as long as that footpath area is greater than 2.5m wide) as long as it doesn't interfere with the movement of persons or vehicles using the footpath.

All persons or businesses wishing to place moveable signs (including banners) outside their property must seek the approval of Council. For the full By-Law and all definitions, placement and restrictions of moveable signs go to www.frc.sa.gov.au

PICHI RICHI MARATHON -

Pichi Richi Marathon - Temporary Road Closures and Speed Restrictions

Sunday 26 June 2022 - 7.30am - 1.00pm

A reminder that the following temporary road closures and speed restrictions will be in place for the 40th Pichi Richi Marathon Sunday 26 June 2022.

The following roads will be closed to traffic with times as outlined:

· Flinders Ranges Way

Between the intersections of West Terrace, Quorn and Woolundunga Avenue, Stirling North (Southbound lanes only) Between 7.30am and 1.00pm

· Park Terrace, Quorn

Between Arden Vale Road and Oval Road, Quorn Between 8.00am and 1.00pm

· Arden Vale Road, Quorn

Between Flinders Ranges Way and Park Terrace, Quorn Between 8.00am and 1.00pm

· Silo Road, Quorn

Between the Caravan Park entrance and West Terrace Between 11.15am and 11.45am

Please make note that the Flinders Ranges Way is only closed in the southbound direction of Quorn to Port Augusta. Northbound from Port Augusta to Quorn will remain open but with a 60km/h speed restriction in place. The road will be monitored by SAPOL and all signage will be in place.

Please DO NOT attempt to travel from Quorn to Port Augusta on Sunday 26 June 2022 between 7.30am and 1.00pm via the Flinders Ranges Way - this includes accessing any side roads - these will also be closed at the highway entrance. Detours, via Wilmington, to Port Augusta, will be in place during this time.

Event vehicles with official signage only will be allowed to travel the road during the event.

We have over 400 participants in the marathon, so please drive safely, be aware of participants in the marathon and all volunteers, obey all official directions and cheer the participants along!
