PARKING CONTROL POLICY

BACKGROUND

Increasing traffic through and within The Flinders Ranges Council (Council), places a high demand for parking spaces across the towns of Quorn and Hawker at peak times of day and year.

The Council is responsible for balancing this demand for car parking with the supply of parking spaces.

Management and control of 'on-street' parking ensures the best use of free road space facilitates safe traffic flow and ensures a fair turnover of on street parking.

POLICY STATEMENT

The Parking Control Policy aims to effectively manage 'on-street' parking within The Flinders Ranges Council region to ensure the safety and convenience of pedestrians, motorists, residents, and businesses. Expiation fees will be collected for breaches of the parking regulations, which will assist in funding the cost of parking surveillance and maintenance.

POLICY STATEMENT

The Council will pursue the following objectives with the management of 'on-street' parking:

- The safety of pedestrians
- The safety of motorists
- The free-flow of traffic
- Access rights to properties
- To provide adequate parking
- To protect the special needs of certain groups e.g. disabled and cyclists
- To protect council property
- To protect private property

and apply the following principles to all parking management decisions made within the Council:

- Safety
- Responsibility
- · Impartiality and consistency
- Professionalism
- · Legality and clarity
- Appropriateness and balance
- Enforcement
- Customer service and responsiveness
- Visibility
- Education and consultation

RESPONSIBILITIES

The Director of Works will be responsible for this policy.
