

BUSH FOOD GARDEN UPDATE

Activities underway

- Working group established and meeting to discuss plantings and garden layout
- Draft garden plans drawn and submitted
- Species list for garden area finalised and orders submitted to nurseries – formal plantings planned for Autumn 2021
- 600 Sandalwood and Quandong seeds planted under host plants adjacent to creek in parklands
- Boxthorn and wild olives controlled between Weir and Diggers bridge of Bitheewie Pinkerton Creek
- Rubbish collected and removed from Parkland
- Garden pathways near pool marked out and scraped with Bobcat
- Large landscaping stones delivered to site
- Garden site sprayed with residual herbicide to prevent weed germination
- Propagation of Eremophilas and Saltbushes, and in greenhouse on McHugh St




Volunteers have steadily been putting together ideas and getting jobs organised for the parklands areas.



Upcoming planned activities:

- Seed collection – Spring
- Propagation of Sandalwood with Alternanthera host cuttings – early Spring
- Continue creek and parklands clean-up : picking up rubbish, clearing weeds, planning signage for existing mature plants along the proposed foot path
- Planning and sourcing replacement plants for parklands area
- Continue direct seeding along creek line

- Earthworks in formal garden area and preparation of soil base for plantings (FRC)
- Laying of gravel over pathways (FRC)
- Installation of irrigation in formal garden area
